

**TOWN OF MEADOW LAKE
BYLAW 11/2005
TRAFFIC BYLAW**

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF MEADOW LAKE TO REGULATE THE OPERATION OF VEHICLES CITED AS THE PARKING AND TRAFFIC BYLAW.

The Council of the Town of Meadow Lake, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. INTERPRETATION

- (a) "administrator" means the Town Administrator of Meadow Lake or an employee of the Town designated by the Administrator to act on behalf of the Town.
- (b) "angle parking" shall mean the parking of vehicles with the right front wheel drawn up to the curb on the right-hand side of the highway, or at a distance of not more than thirty (30) centimetres from such curb, the vehicle to be placed at an angle of forty-five (45) degrees with the curb;
- (c) "curb" shall mean the lateral boundaries of a roadway, whether or not marked by curbing;
- (d) "heavy vehicle" means a motor vehicle with or without load which alone or together with any trailer, semi-trailer or other vehicle being towed, weighs 4.5 tonnes or more;
- (e) "highway" shall mean any street or public highway within the municipality, but does not include a provincial highway therein as designated pursuant to the provisions of The Highways Act;
- (f) "parallel parking" shall mean the parking of a vehicle with both right wheels thereof drawn up to the curb on the right-hand side of the highway, or at a distance of not more than thirty (30) centimetres from such curb;
- (g) "park", parking, shall mean the stopping or standing of a vehicle whether occupied or not, otherwise than temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading of goods and/or materials, or in obedience to traffic regulations, signs or signals;
- (h) "place of public assembly" means schools, theatres, moving picture theatres, churches, hockey and skating rinks, dance halls and public assembly halls;
- (i) "power turn" means to maneuver a vehicle in such a manner to cause the rear of the vehicle to depart from its ordinary line of progress by the sudden use of acceleration and/or braking;
- (j) "speed zone" means any portion of a highway within the Town of Meadow Lake, as designated herein, and identified by a sign erected and maintained at each end thereof, indicating the maximum speed available thereto;
- (k) "U-Turn" shall mean the turning of a vehicle so as to cause it to proceed in the opposite direction from which it was proceeding immediately prior to the commencement of such turn;
- (l) "vehicle" shall have the meaning ascribed to it by The Highway Traffic Act;
- (m) "lug vehicle" means any truck, portable engine or traction engine having metal spikes, lugs or cleats projecting from the face of the wheels or tires thereof, or having metal track tread;
- (n) "municipality" means the Town of Meadow Lake;
- (o) "stop" means a complete cessation from movement.

2. SCOPE

- (a) "STOP" Streets
The streets and avenues as listed in Appendix 1 are designated as "Stop" streets.
- (b) "YIELD" Streets
The streets and avenues as listed in Appendix 2 are designated as "Yield" streets.
- (c) "NO U-TURN" Intersections
The intersections of streets and avenues, approached from all four (4) directions as listed in Appendix 3 are designated as "No U-Turn" intersections.

3. INFRACTIONS

- (a) "STOP" Streets
The provisions of The Highway Traffic Act shall apply to all traffic approaching and facing a "stop" sign erected and maintained in accordance with the provisions of section 4(a).
- (b) "YIELD" Streets
The provisions of The Highway Traffic Act shall apply to all traffic approaching and facing a "yield" sign erected and maintained in accordance with the provisions of section 4(b).
- (c) MISCELLANEOUS SIGNS
 - (1) No person shall, except where authorized by resolution of Council or when duly authorized by law, erect upon or immediately adjacent to any highway, any sign, marker, signal or light or any advertising sign device.
 - (2) No person shall deface, damage, destroy or remove any sign or marker erected pursuant to this Bylaw.
- (d) LUG VEHICLES
 - (1) No person shall propel, operate or drive any lug vehicle upon any highway within the municipality without first having obtained of the Administrator, a permit in writing authorizing same.
 - (2) The Administrator is hereby authorized to issue permits in writing for the purpose of section 3(d)(1) of this Bylaw in any case where the applicant therefore has signed a written undertaking in Form 1, Appendix 5. Provided that the Administrator shall not issue any such permit unless he is satisfied that with reasonable care in operation the lug vehicle may be propelled or driven over any highway without damage resulting thereto or to any bridge or culvert thereon.
 - (3) Nothing contained in section 3(d)(1) shall be deemed to preclude the transport of a lug vehicle as herein defined over any highway where same is being carried by means of rubber-tired trailer or other conveyance equipped with rubber tires.

(e) PARKING

- (1) Except as otherwise provided herein, the parking of vehicles is permitted on all highways within the municipality.
- (2)
 - (a) subject to the provisions of subsection (b) no person shall park a vehicle in any lane, nor in any streets so as to obstruct the entrance to any lane or to a driveway or approach leading to private premises;
 - (b) notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a), a farm truck or commercial vehicle may be parked in any lane for the purpose of taking on or discharging cargo, provided no such truck or vehicle shall be so parked for a period exceeding thirty (30) minutes at one time, unless written permission has first been obtained from the Administrator or a police officer of the municipality for an extension of such time limit.
- (3)
 - (a) subject to subsection (b), every person parking a vehicle upon a highway within the municipality where parking is permitted, shall parallel park same;
 - (b) every person parking a vehicle upon the highways listed in Appendix 6 shall angle park same.
- (4) No person shall park a vehicle in any "No Parking" area as designated in Appendix 7 at any time whether such areas are marked on the curb or otherwise erected or mentioned in accordance with the provisions of section 4(d) to indicate that parking therein is prohibited.
- (5) No person shall park a vehicle within five (5) metres of any street intersection or fire hydrant, three (3) metres of a lane or driveway in an angle parking zone or two (2) metres of a lane in all other areas.
- (6) No person shall park a vehicle on any highway at one place for a period of time exceeding twenty-four (24) consecutive hours.
- (7) No vehicle shall be parked with the engine running, unless it is in the charge of and under the control of a competent person, 16 years or older, or unless all doors to the said vehicle are locked.
- (8) Council may, by resolution of Council, prohibit parking on any street or portion thereof, temporarily for street sweeping, snow removal or any reason they deem necessary subject to appropriate signs being erected indicating times and days that the parking restriction is in force.
- (9)
 - (a) Any vehicle parking in a metered angled parking area shall turn to its right and park at an angle of approximately 45 and in a parallel parking area within 0.3 metres of the curb and in all areas a vehicle must park within the painted lines marking the parking stall and not occupy more than one parking space.
 - (b) On all streets of the Town of Meadow Lake, except those areas designated in subsection (a) and (b) hereof, all vehicles shall park on the right hand side of the street in the direction they are facing, parallel and not more than 0.5 metres from the curb or drainage ditch, as the case may be.

Parking and Traffic Bylaw 11/2005 - 3(e) INFRACTIONS – continued

- (c) In the areas designated for angle parking as set out in subsection (a) hereof, only passenger cars and trucks not exceeding 2.1 metres (7 feet) in width and 5.8 (19 feet) metres in length shall be permitted to park.
- (d) No unregistered vehicle shall park on any street or lane in the Town.
- (e) No person shall park in any designated parking area specified in Appendix 7, more than one hour.
- (10) (a) subject to subsection (b), no person shall park any commercial vehicle designed for carrying or intended for the carrying of oil, gasoline or other inflammable, combustible or explosive material, within 30 metres from any building in the municipality used or intended for use, in whole or in part, as a place of dwelling, a hotel or place of public assembly;
- (b) nothing in subsection (a) shall be deemed to restrict the parking of any such vehicle for such period of time as may be necessary to take on or discharge cargo.
- (11) (a) No person shall park any truck, tractor unit, trailer, bus, commercial or farm vehicle which is more than 2.1 meters (7 feet) in width, (excluding mirrors) or more than 7.5 meters (24.5 feet) in length within the corporate limits of the Town of Meadow Lake, unless:
 - i) the vehicle is being loaded or unloaded
 - ii) the vehicle is parked in an area designated by the Town of Meadow Lake as a Commercial Zone; or
 - iii) written permission from the Administrator of the Town of Meadow Lake has been obtained prior to parking the vehicle.
- (b) No owner, occupant, licensee or permittee of a parking place or private property place, except for the owner, occupant, licensee or permittee of a parking place or private property which is located in an area designated by the Town of Meadow Lake as a Commercial Zone shall permit or grant consent to, in accordance with section 3(e)(7), any person to park any truck, tractor unit, trailer, bus, commercial or farm vehicle which is more than 2.1 meters (7 feet) in width (excluding mirrors) or more than 7.5 meters (24.5 feet) in length upon such parking place or private property unless:
 - i) the vehicle is being loaded or unloaded; or
 - ii) written permission from the Administrator of the Town of Meadow Lake has been obtained prior to parking the vehicle.
- (c) No person shall park any vehicle on 9th Street West and 1st Avenue East and West.
- (12) No person shall park a vehicle within two meters of a Canada Post community mail box.
- (f) POWER TURNS

The operator of a vehicle shall not execute "power turns" on any highway in the municipality.

(g) SNOWMOBILES

- (1) Subject to the provisions contained in the Snowmobile Act and the Highway Traffic Act, it shall be lawful to operate a snowmobile between the hours of 7:00am and 11:00pm on any public highway except Provincial Highways #4 and #55, within the limits of the municipality, Monday to Saturday inclusive, and between 9:00am and 11:00pm on Sunday.
- (2) Notwithstanding Section (g) (1) of this bylaw, it shall be lawful to operate a snowmobile on the portion of Provincial Highway #4 for the purpose of crossing the Provincial Highway, at the intersection of Ninth Avenue West and Highway #4.
- (3) Before crossing Provincial Highway #4, all snowmobile operators shall yield the right of way to vehicles on Highway #4.

(h) SPEED

- (1) Subject to subsection (2), (3), (4), and (5) and excluding Highway 4, no person shall operate a vehicle in the municipality at a speed greater than forty (40) kilometers per hour.
- (2) No person shall operate a vehicle at a speed greater than thirty (30) km/hour in the school zones as set out in Appendix 4 between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on school days.
- (3) No person shall operate a vehicle at a speed greater than thirty (30) km/hour on Third (3rd) and Fourth (4th) Avenues between Sixth (6th) and Seventh (7th) Streets West or on 6th and 7th Street West between 3rd and 4th Avenues West (Westview Playground)
- (4) No person shall operate a vehicle at a speed greater than thirty (30) km/hour on Centre Street and First (1st) Street West between Sixth (6th) and Seventh (7th) Avenues or on 6th and 7th Avenue West between Centre Street and 1st Street West (Martin Gran Playground)
- (5) No person shall operate a vehicle at a speed greater than fifty (50) kilometers per hour on 1st Avenue East and West.
- (6) No person shall operate a vehicle at a speed greater than thirty (30) kilometres per hour on 3rd Avenue East between 1st and 2nd Street East or 2nd Street East between 2nd and 3rd Avenues East (O.O.R.P. Playground).

(i) U-TURNS

- (1) No person shall cause a vehicle to make a U-Turn at the intersection of a street with a lane or at any other point between street/avenue intersections in the municipality.
- (2) No person shall cause a vehicle to make a U-Turn at the intersections designated as "No U-Turn" (Appendix 3) intersections. This shall apply to all traffic approaching and facing a "No U-Turn" sign erected and maintained in accordance with the provisions of section 4(c).

(j) WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS - TRUCK ROUTES

- (1) No person shall operate a vehicle or a combination of vehicles when the combined gross weight of the vehicle(s) with or without a load exceeds 5,500 kg (12,125 pounds) except on Highways No. 4 and 55 which are designated HEAVY TRUCK AND DANGEROUS GOODS ROUTES, and subject to the same weight restrictions as referred to in the Highway Transportation Act.
- (2) Subsection (1) shall not apply to school buses or to vehicles making deliveries or pick ups on any highway in the municipality provided that the operator of the vehicle(s) uses the most direct route from and to the Heavy Truck Route. The combined gross weight of these vehicles must not exceed 35 tonnes (77,161lbs.).
- (3) The provisions of section 46 of the Police Act and Section 71 of the Highway Act shall apply to the operators of vehicles referred to in subsection (1) and (2).
- (4) Subsection (1) shall not apply to empty gravel truck, farm truck or highway tractor unit operators who park their vehicles in their own yard in an R3 or RA residential area, or an M1 or M2 light industrial area, that does not abutt pavement and who access their residence or business by the most direct non-paved route.

(k) BICYCLES

No person shall operate a bicycle on a sidewalk.

(l) GENERAL

- (1) No person shall clean any vehicle on any highway.
- (2) Vehicle repairs, including changes of tires, shall not be made on any street unless in the case of emergency repairs.
- (3) All traffic on the street and sidewalks shall, notwithstanding the provisions of this Bylaw, be subject to any temporary or emergency direction of the Police or Fire Chief for the purpose of relieving congestion of traffic, preventing accidents, performing maintenance or street cleaning, or meeting unforeseen conditions.
- (4) No person shall operate a motor vehicle on any highway, parking lot or service station lot or entrance or exit thereto in any manner so as to cause the driven tires to spin whereby stones or gravel might be thrown from the spinning wheels and/or squeal.
- (5) (a) No vehicle shall cross a fire hose, unless it is protected with planking and provisions have been made to cross it by the fire department.

(b) The operator or owner of any vehicle that violates subsection (a) hereof shall be, in addition to any other penalty prescribed by law, responsible for any damage to any hose, coupling or any other equipment damaged and any Court hearing such an offense may in addition to any other penalty order that person to pay for such damages.

- (6) Any person may with the consent of the building inspector cross a sidewalk with a vehicle at a point other than a regular crossing, but such permit shall only be granted on condition that the applicant cover such sidewalk with planking at least four (4) cm in thickness, securely fastened or tapered or bevelled off at the ends so as not to be an obstruction to the pedestrians, and construct across the drain gutter or water course opposite the proposed crossing, a good and sufficient bridge, planks, or other proper and sufficient material so constructed as not to obstruct said drain gutter or water course.
- (7) PARADES
 - (a) Any group of pedestrians marching or walking on the street and numbering ten (10) or more, except the militia, and any group of vehicles numbering five (5) or more and proceeding under a common leadership, except funeral processions, shall be deemed a parade.
 - (b) No parade shall be held without first obtaining a permit from the Town who shall designate or approve the hour and the route of the parade.
 - (c) No driver of a vehicle nor any pedestrian shall drive, ride or walk through a military, or other parade or procession or in any way obstruct or interfere with same.
- (8) No person shall, whether by using or by means of, the horn, engine, exhaust system, braking system, tires making contact with the roadway or otherwise, create or cause the emission of any loud and unnecessary noise from the motor vehicle, any part thereof, or anything that the motor vehicle or a part thereof comes into contact with.
- (9) The Special Constable or Administrator of the Town of Meadow Lake shall have the right to impound any vehicle, providing that:
 - (a) the owner of the vehicle owes three or more outstanding fines to the urban municipality for parking offences,
 - (b) the period for appealing against the imposition and amount of those fines has expired,
 - (c) at least two notices have been sent at least one week apart, notifying the owner that the fines are outstanding,
 - (d) and a justice having been satisfied by evidence provided by way of oath, affidavit, or statutory declaration of the existence of the facts mentioned in clauses (a) to (c) has issued an order authorizing the removal or impoundment.
- (10) The municipality may retain the vehicle seized under subsection (9) until the amount of the outstanding fines and the costs incurred in removing and impounding the vehicle have been paid, or may, if the fines or costs have not been paid within a period of 30 days, sell the vehicle at a public auction.

4. SIGNS

- (a) Council shall cause to be erected and maintained at the right-hand side of every street intersecting a "Stop" street, at a distance of approximately three (3) metres from the point of intersection, an appropriate sign containing the word "Stop". Such signs shall be so placed that it will face traffic which is approaching the "Stop" street.
- (b) Council shall cause to be erected and maintained at the right-hand side of every street intersecting a "Yield" street at a distance of approximately three (3) metres from such intersections, an appropriate "Yield" sign. Such sign shall be so placed that it will face traffic which is approaching the "Yield" street.
- (c) Council shall cause to be erected and maintained at intersections designated as "No U-Turn" intersections, signs prohibiting U-Turns. Such sign shall face approaching traffic to said intersections.
- (d) Council shall cause to be erected and maintained appropriate signs or curb markings to indicate "No Parking" areas. Such signs or curb markings shall be visible from the part of the highway to which the restriction applies.
- (e) Council may by resolution provide for the erection and maintenance on any highway, and at any designated point or points thereon, of such signs as it may deem expedient for warning, guidance, directions or information thereon.

5. PENALTIES

- (a) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of subsections 3(c),(d),(f),(g),(i),(j) and (l) of this bylaw is guilty of an offense and liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the municipality.
- (b) For violation of any parking offense under subsection 3(e), except 3(e)(11), a Police Officer or Town employee may issue a parking ticket of the kind used for parking meter offenses prescribing a penalty of \$20.00 with the provision that if payment is received within ninety-six hours immediately following the offense, the Town shall cancel \$10.00 of the said penalty and accept \$10.00 as payment in full. If the prescribed penalty is not paid voluntarily within the prescribed time, charges may be laid, and if the person(s) is found guilty of an offense, is liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Municipality."
- (c) The penalty for the contravention of section 3(k) is as follows:
 - (1) for the first infraction impounding the bicycle for seven (7) days;
 - (2) for the second or additional infractions impounding the bicycle for fourteen (14) days.
- (d) The penalty for the contravention of section 3(a),(b) and (h) of this bylaw shall be the same as those prescribed for like offences in the Highway Traffic Act.

- (e) For violation of any parking offense under subsection 3(e)11(a) and 3(e)11(b), a Police Officer or Town employee may issue a parking ticket of the kind used for parking meter offenses prescribing a penalty of \$25.00 for the first offense, \$50.00 for the second offense, \$100.00 for the third offense and towing of the vehicle if it is the third offense. If the penalty is not paid voluntarily within the prescribed time, charges may be laid, and if the person(s) is found guilty of an offense, is liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Municipality.
- (f) For violation of any parking offense under subsection 3(e)11(c), the fine shall be \$50.00 for all vehicles.”

6. IMPOUNDING

- (1) Any member of the police force, special constable or administrator may remove or cause to be removed any vehicle that is unlawfully placed, left or kept on any street or lane, public parking place, or other public place, or on municipally-owned property, and to impound or store such vehicle.
- (2) Where a vehicle has been impounded or stored after it has been removed under subsection (1), it may be retained at a place designated by Council for a period of (30) days from date of removal unless the cost of removal, impounding and storage are sooner paid. Upon payment of the full costs herein, the vehicle may be released to the owner thereof.
- (3) If the costs of removal, impounding and storage are not paid within the period of thirty days as specified in subsection (2), the municipality shall have the right to recover same from the owner of the vehicle by:
 - (a) legal action in a court of competent jurisdiction;
 - (b) sale by public auction on publication of a notice designating the time and place of sale at least ten days prior to the sale in a newspaper circulating in the municipality and on sending such notice by registered mail to the owner at the address appearing on the last registration of the vehicle.
 - (c) sale by sealed tender, with the public notice being advertised in the local newspaper, identifying the vehicle to be tendered and the deadline for tenders to be received.

- 7. Bylaws # 6/2001, 12/2001, 8/2002, 15/2003 and 14/2004 are repealed. This Bylaw will come into force and take effect on the date approved by the Highway Traffic Board of the Province of Saskatchewan.

I declare that:

- (1) I will use reasonable care in propelling, operating or driving such lug vehicles over the highway to prevent any damage resulting to the highway.
- (2) I will, when operating such lug vehicle over any bridge or culvert on any highway or on any specified bridge or culvert thereon, without first laying down on such bridge or culvert planks or timbers of not less than 5 cm in thickness or less than 4 metres in length, such planks or timbers to be laid lengthwise across the bridge or culvert in the direction in which the lug vehicle is proceeding in such manner that they will support the wheels or tread of the lug vehicle on both sides thereof throughout its entire passage over such bridge or culvert.
- (3) I will pay for all damages caused to such highway or to any bridge or culvert thereon as a result of propelling, operating or driving such lug vehicle thereon.
